Average attendance for each class for last half term is as follows:

The overall attendance for the school for last half term is 97.9% and as you can see Year 1 has the best overall attendance for the half term.

This month 96% of children achieved our arrival time target of 12 and those children will receive a wrist band congratulating them on this. In particular I would like to congratulate the children in Year 2 because all of the children in this class reached the target. Year 1 had the least number of children reaching the target. The target for November is 22 and it would be great to have an increase in the number of children reaching this, particularly in Year 1.
