

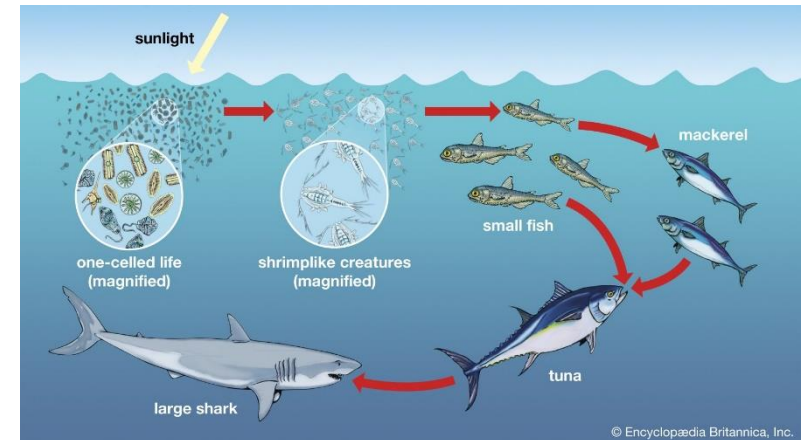


KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER: Science Year 2 Block 5 Coastal Habitats

Key vocabulary

Coast	The area where the land and sea meet.
Beach	An area where the land meets the sea, made up of fine, loose sediment (sand).
Cliff	A high area where the land meets the sea, made of hard rock.
Habitat	A natural environment of an animal or plant.
Adaptation	How plants and animals change to fit their environment.
Predator	An animal that eats other animals.
Prey	An animal that is hunted for food by another animal.
Producer	Plants that make their own food.
