## Key Vocabulary

<b>North</b>	A direction pointing up or forwards on a map.
<b>South</b>	A direction pointing down or backwards on a map.
<b>Poles</b>	The top or bottom point of the globe.
<b>Arctic</b>	The area around the south pole.
<b>Antarctica</b>	Something you would notice on a walk.
<b>Equator</b>	The point in between the north and south pole.
<b>Human Feature</b>	Something made by man.
<b>Physical Feature</b>	Something that has happened naturally.
<b>Compass</b>	A tool used to navigate often by finding north.
<b>Globe</b>	A sphere-shaped map that shows the world.

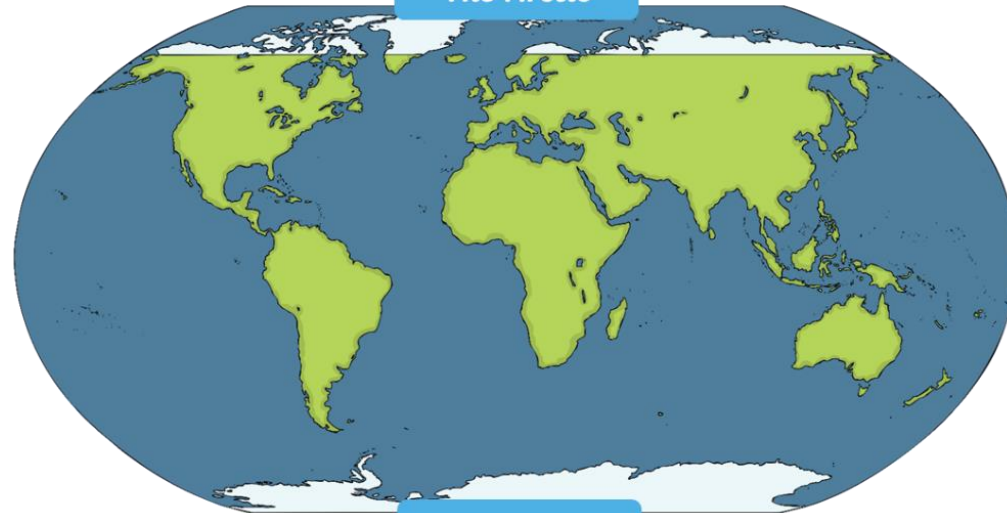


## Comparing Regions
