## Key Vocabulary

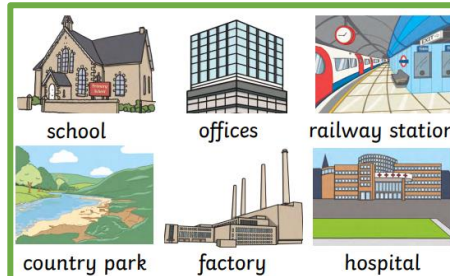
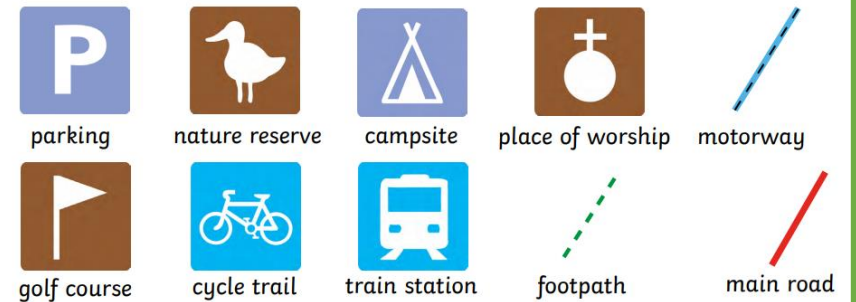
<b>Local Area</b>	The area around where you live.
<b>Map</b>	A drawing of an area shown from above.
<b>Aerial View</b>	What somewhere would look like from the sky. (Birds Eye View)
<b>Route</b>	How you get somewhere.
<b>Features</b>	Something you would notice on a walk.
<b>Key</b>	Symbols used to show features on a map.
<b>Direction</b>	The way someone or something is moving.

## Map Key

Some maps can be awfully hard to read. Map makers will use symbols (keys) to point out features and make it easier to find what you are looking for!



## Local Features

Different areas will have different local features. Some locations might have lots of schools, other places might not have many schools. So, it is important that maps show us the features of an area so we can see what we might find.

## Arial Maps

Maps often show us the 'birds eye view' of an area. So, you must imagine you are looking down from the sky when you read a map.
