ENGLISH

Writing

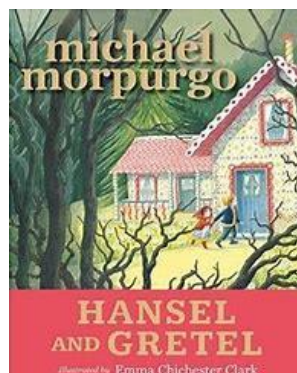
- Practice forming lower-case letters and capital letters correctly with attention to size to one another throughout a word.
- When writing segment spoken words into phonemes with increasing independence.
- Learn to spell non-negotiable words
- Writing stories narrative and poems based on Traditional tales

Phonics/Spelling

- Revise and write phonic sounds from Year 1 to develop fluency in reading and increased accuracy in spelling.

Reading

- Read text daily in class, sounding out unfamiliar words more accurately.
- Retell traditional tales read in class. Learn poems by heart read in class.



Topic – Castles

- In Design Technology, History, Art, Music and Geography explore castles as a theme.
- Local castles - Locate castles near to us, sketch them then locate them on a map.
- Learn about the features of medieval castles.
- Banquet menu - Design a healthy menu for a King or Queen's banquet
- Sing songs about marching; add music to poems about castles.
- Design a coat of arms.
- Read stories with a castle theme.

MATHS – Place Value, Addition and Subtraction

- Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in 10s from any number, forward and backward
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (10s, 1s)
- Estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line
- Compare numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words
- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20

Knowing the importance of following rules to create an atmosphere where we can all learn. Setting goals and targets. Using relaxation to help us know the importance of quiet time in keeping us healthy. Respecting difference between one another.
