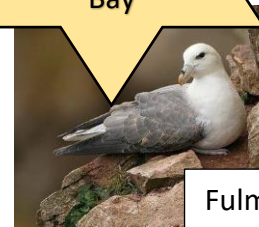


Vocabulary Dozen		
<b>low tide</b>	The tide at its lowest water level, or the time when this happens.	The island can only be reached at low tide.
<b>high tide</b>	The highest point reached by a tide, or the time of day when this happens.	You can't walk along the beach at high tide.
<b>tidal erosion</b>	The gradual destruction of land by the sea	Tidal erosion caused Marsden rock to split into two columns.
<b>sea stack</b>	A landform consisting of a steep and often vertical column of rock in the <b>sea</b> near a coast.	Marsden Rock is a sea stack of limestone.
<b>limestone</b>	Rock made from coral, shells and the skeletons of sea creatures	Local industry consisted of a small limestone quarry.
<b>topographical</b>	Describes the physical features of an area of land.	Topographical features include mountains, hills and valleys.
<b>grotto</b>	A cave or cavern	Marsden grotto has a famous pub in it.
<b>cliff</b>	A high steep face of rock or earth	He stood on the edge of the cliff.
<b>coastline</b>	The outline of a coast	They admired the rugged beauty of the coastline
<b>Bird colonies</b>	A large congregation of one or more species of <b>bird</b> that nest or roost in a particular location.	There are four different bird colonies at Marsden Bay.
<b>quarry</b>	A hole or a pit in the ground from which workers remove stone.	The quarry at Marsden was the main industry.
<b>village</b>	A community made up of a small number of houses, usually in a country area.	Marsden was originally a small village.

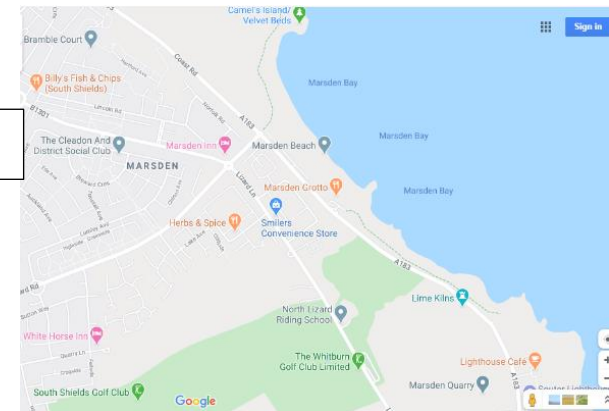
