Literacy

Our Focus text for this half term is "The Day the Crayons Quit" by Drew Daywalt

- To write simple recounts and lists based on our text.
- To write letters using the same style as the book
- To be able to order events in our writing using, first, next, after and then.
- To write their own stories using a clear beginning, middle and end.
- To continue with our weekly guided reading lessons, focussing on higher order reading skills.
- It will also be the Phonics screening test so all extra reading will be of great benefit!

Numeracy

- Bridge through 20 when adding a single digit number.
- Count in multiples of 2, 3, 5 and 10 and apply to simple problems.
- Solve practical problems that involve combining groups of 2, 5 or 10, or sharing into equal groups
- Recall the doubles and halves of all numbers to at least 10
- Read o'clock and half past times on an analogue clock
- Apply mental strategies to solve money and time problems.
- Handle data to solve a problem by organising information in a list or table.
- Explain and verbalise processes in numeracy.

Topic – Under the Sea

- To recognise and name sea creatures and then group them based on observable features.
- To be able to label sea creatures and to look at their diet.
- To look at the oceans and continents on a world map and be able to name them.
- To find where certain sea creatures live.

I.C.T.

- To revise E-Safety and the correct and safe use of equipment in school.
- To enter data into a database and make simple bar graphs.
