Health and Wellbeing

We now employ a **school nurse** who is in school once every three weeks. She is able to support with any concerns you may have about your children ie toilet training, anxiety, behavioural, dietary issues and learning development concerns.

We also employ a **school counsellor** who visits once a week. There is a waiting list for this service and therefore we are currently looking to employ a second counsellor. If this is something that you feel may benefit your child and you are not already on our waiting list then please get in touch via the school office.

Mrs Aydeniz is currently training to be our **Mental Health and Wellbeing Lead**. This is funded by the Department of Education and aims to ensure all children and adults in school can gain the necessary support where needed.

Behaviour and Rewards

As part of our positive approach to behaviour and learning we have introduced some extra rewards into school. Your child may receive a 'Star of the Week' award for a particular subject or something they have worked hard at. There is also 'Tea with Mr D' where a child from each year group joins Mr Donnelly for juice and biscuits and a chat. Children are also encouraged to take lovely pieces of work to show Mrs Ash and we continue to have our rewards assembly. As part of our Class Dojo system there are also whole class rewards such as an extra playtime or a film at the end of the term.

The children have also been enjoying learning in the forest and building on their numbers skills.










<u>Year 1</u> have been developing their hand-eye co-ordination through cricket, learning printing skills and developing their knowledge of minibeasts.


Year 4 have been getting very creative.
