

Dear Parents and Carers,

At Dinnington we explain to the children that 'Bullying' is when someone is unkind 'Several Times On Purpose' S.T.O.P and we teach them how to recognise and deal with any unkind behaviour. This is ongoing in school but we also like to highlight this during Anti-Bullying Week.

Anti-Bullying Week is coordinated In England and Wales by the Anti-Bullying Alliance and takes place from 15 to 19 November 2021 and it has the theme One Kind Word.

The week will begin with **Odd Socks Day on 15th March** which is supported by CBBC and CBeebies star Andy Day and his band Andy and the Odd Socks.

Children and staff will all be encouraged to wear odd socks and we will be talking about celebrating our difference and following the theme of 'One Kind Word'

COVID-19 Update

We are really grateful for your ongoing support. We know that we are all now suffering from information overload and the messages seem to get muddier every day. The biggest confusion seems to be around testing, symptoms and school attendance. As a summary, and based on your most frequently asked questions, here's what you need to know:

- Children with symptoms should not be in school, ring us if you are unsure
- Everyone with symptoms should have a PCR test booked online
- A LFD test (home tests) are not suitable for people with symptoms they do not reliably tell you that you don't have COVID
- Children are presenting with different symptoms to the three listed NHS symptoms, so caution around symptoms is advised
- We will let you know when we have had a confirmed case in school but we no longer inform you if we think your child has been a close contact
- If someone in your household has COVID, other people in the household can attend work and school they will need a PCR test but don't have to self-isolate while waiting for the result
- We will change our practice and introduce new measures if we meet the thresholds set out in our contingency plan (available on the school website)
